Dr. Campbell is senior consultant for Campbell and Associates Consulting, LLC and has presented on the aftermath of suicide since 1988. He consults on forensic suicidology cases and trains communities in the USA and internationally to implement programs that reduce the impact of suicide.

While serving as Executive Director of the Baton Rouge Crisis Intervention Center from 1989-2005 Dr. Campbell developed the first Active Postvention Model (APM) known as the LOSS Team. His work has been featured in three Discovery Channel documentaries.

He is a Licensed Clinical Social Worker and in 1997 was honored as social worker of the year by NASW Louisiana. Dr. Campbell is a past President of the American Association of Suicidology, and is certified in thanatology.

# Rationale for workshop

Suicide provides unique challenges requiring specific awareness and training. This workshop will address key components needed for responding to those impacted by suicide (postvention). The workshop will provide participants general and specific skills in suicide postvention. Participants will also be given self care information useful when crisis intervention skills are required.

### **Workshop topics:**

- An examination of how each person's value system is engaged in a crisis
- Crisis theory: a description of the development of a crisis and steps to use in resolving it
- Metaphor for coping: a vital tool for helping someone through a crisis
- Understanding the paradoxical nature of suicide
- Recent at-risk group data
- Current theories on suicide
- A school based postvention exercise will be presented for those wishing to participate

Power Point, handouts, and active participation by attendees will be used to reinforce the material presented in the workshop.
